Why Bring One?

Why Bring One?



With the Bring One Campaign and the street evangelism the day before, we are opening the arena day with an invitation to salvation, redemption, and mercy. We believe that along with many salvations, we will also see many signs, wonders, and miracles. We are not interested in numbers



just for the sake of numbers, but want to see the love of God on display through the church and brings lasting impact to the region.

“And it shall come to pass that everyone who calls on the name of the LORD shall be saved.” **JOEL 2:32**

Who to Bring



Bring one *who needs emotional or physical healing.*

Bring one *who needs salvation.*

Bring one *who has been outcast.*

Bring one *who has backslidden.*

Bring one *who needs Jesus.*



It's important to follow the Holy Spirit and minister to those He leads us to. There are many people we don't know that are in the darkest places, but there are also people we *do* know that are struggling right in front of us. While we believe that no one is out of the reach of God's love, we want to encourage you to reach out to those you may already have some level of relationship with. Reach out to those on the fringes, the cusp of salvation/rededication. Some may feel called to go to the darkest places and minister to complete strangers, but the truth is, we all know family, friends, and coworkers that need Jesus.

Where to Bring One



We're challenging every person attending the Uprise on 9.7.24 to bring one person with them, but this isn't about a one day event. We challenge you to focus on a relationship that can grow over time. You may want to bring your "one" with you to church, to our pre-event rallies, or to the street evangelism day, but we also encourage you to bring them out for coffee, a meal, or to your house. Leading up to September 7th, and after, we want people to feel genuinely cared for.

How to Reach Them



1. Pray
2. Sow Seeds
3. Follow Through
4. Love



We believe prayer is essential to everything we do. In John 15:7-8 Jesus says, *“7 If you remain in me and my words remain in you, ask whatever you wish, and it will be done for you. 8 This is to my Father’s glory, that you bear much fruit, showing yourselves to be my disciples.”* Part of being fruitful is asking! Prayer is not a passive work but like tilling the soil before planting the seeds. We pray for boldness and opportunities to share the gospel, as well as hearts to be softened and eyes to be opened. Prayer also helps us remember that we are not in control of the results, we are only responsible for our obedience.





Look for opportunities to bring truth

There isn't a single situation that the truth, wisdom, and counsel of God can't bring clarity to. Stay alert and ready to shine the light of God's truth so that His love would be revealed. We are not trying to win arguments but win one another. We are not trying to prove that we are right, but reveal the love of God.

Discern the moment

Be slow to speak and quick to listen. It's important to actively listen to the person without planning our next response, or reacting out of our emotions. Simple authentic conversations can change a person's life, so slow down and let the Holy Spirit guide you.



Be willing to share your own stories and testimony

The conversation isn't about you, but sharing your experiences can help others see that they are not alone and that they don't have to be perfect to receive the gospel.

Be you!

Other ministries and peoples stories can be incredibly encouraging, but it's important to remember that you are not them. God already made a Billy Graham, He made you to be you. There's nothing wrong with using others' methods, but remember to be you.

Follow Through



When you plant a seed it needs to be cultivated and cared for. When it comes to the Bring One Campaign, we aren't asking everyone to stop spreading the gospel except to one person, nor are we



asking anyone to cast a smaller net and sow less seeds. We are simply asking everyone to be intentional with at least one person, so when you commit to one person, follow through and show up. Jesus teaches us to let our yes be yes, and our no be no. Your “one” will be watching to see that you practice what you preach, that you really care; show them.



Love must be our motive! 1 Corinthians 13 and 16 encourages us to do everything in love, without it we are nothing. We are not trying to follow formulas or complete transactions, we are simply living and loving the way God commands us to. Remember, your responsibility is obedience and God's responsibility is the result.



Follow Up



Outside of church services and events, invite your “one” into your life and show up in theirs. It’s important that we don’t invest time just to leave them after an event. We all need each other! Some things we can do to help newly saved and recommitted believers is:

- Help them find a church
- Get them plugged into a community of like minded friends
- Disciple them, or be discipled with them
- Pray with them
- Buy them a Bible

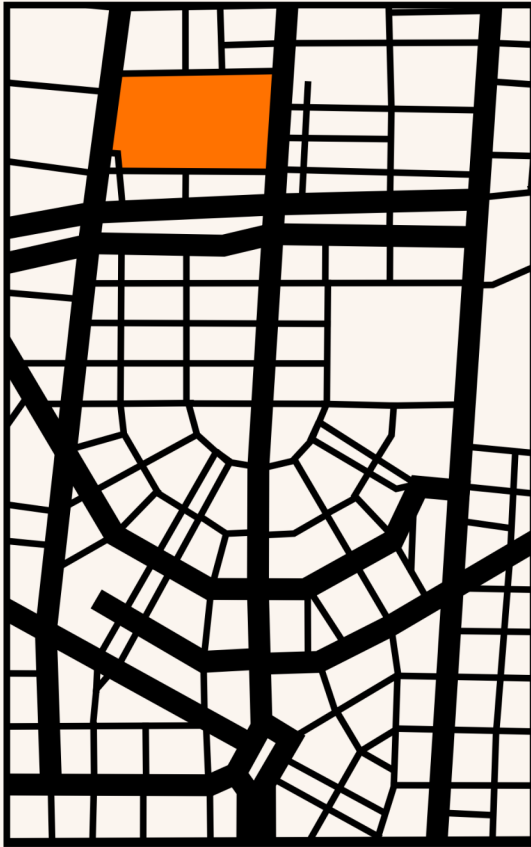
